### PERFORMANCE CENTRES

Performance Centres are an exciting development in the Player Pathway that were introduced in January 2017. There are seventeen Performance Centres strategically located across England to maximise opportunity and player development. Through the delivery in Performance Centres, England Hockey and the Regions want to move talent development to a higher level.

Performance Centres aim to:

- Develop an oversupply of high calibre players for National Age Group Squads
- Provide frequent, exceptionally high quality contact time for a targeted group of players
- Provide appropriate competition to support player development
- Provide high quality education that effectively prepares young players for performance environments

The NHA wish to appoint one Goal Keeper Coach to the Leeds Performance Centre (covering both genders).

### ROLE SUMMARY: GOAL KEEPER COACH

The Regional Hockey Associations are looking for talented, inspirational Goal Keeper Coaches who:

- Can oversee the player experience for all Goal Keepers within the Performance Centre
- Can support coaches in creating an intensive and pressurised training environment to encourage the development of effective decision makers and highly skilled players who can repeatedly perform at junior international level
- Will consistently apply the Golden Thread and National Development Themes
- Can support an inspirational developmental culture that supports player development, facilitates learning and gives players a strong sense of individual and collective responsibility
- Will commit to their own personal development and see the importance of this for the benefit of the players

### KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Attend no less than 50% of training evenings (dates decided with other Performance Centre staff)
- Attend all full day training sessions (these will be weekend days and school holidays)
- As requested by the Region, attend a number of competition dates
- Share responsibility for creating a specific plan for supporting all Goal Keepers within the Performance Centre environment, taking on clearly defined roles and responsibilities
- Support the Head Coach in the planning of all pitch activity; in line with your clearly defined role,



this will involve leading certain aspects of on pitch delivery

- Play a significant role in the delivery of all pitch sessions with the other contracted members of the Performance Centre coaching team; effectively applying National Development Themes and the Golden Thread
- Work with the Leeds Performance Centre regional management and administrative systems to support delivery and respect any regulations set out in the regional terms of reference for the Performance Centre
- In an intense, training and competition environment, prioritise player development over competition result
- Work with young athletes and be responsible for their welfare and protection
- Support the Head Coach to produce summative written feedback to players

## ADMINISTRATION

Work with all coaches within the centre as a team to meet summative player feedback and selection requirements, including:

- Leading the written summative feedback for Goal Keepers within the Centre
- Assisting Head Coach with selection decisions
- Delivering formative feedback to players
- Attending regional CPD days/events

## PERSON SPECIFICATION

To be eligible, candidates must hold a (minimum) Level 2 or EH Coach equivalent qualification

## ESSENTIAL

- Extensive hockey coaching experience; particularly relating to the application of the Golden Thread in a talent development environment
- A forward thinking Goal Keeper coach who understands a games-based and constraint led coaching approach
- A solid understanding of the principles of Goal Keeping, National Development Themes and an ability to communicate these with others
- Dynamic coach who is capable of delivering exceptional development experiences to our highest potential young hockey players
- Demonstrable experience of working collaboratively within a coaching team
- Ability to exercise sound judgement, observe confidentiality and use discretion and initiative
- Self-motivated and able to work independently and as part of a team
- Is efficient and organised, with strong awareness of self and self-regulation and the ability to meet competing demands through effective time management
- Have completed an enhanced DBS check through England Hockey within the last three years
- Have attended a SCUK Safeguarding and Protecting Young People in Sport workshop within the last three years
- Have a First Aid qualification(achieved in the last three years)
- Valid Public Liability Insurance for coaching young people

## DESIRABLE

- Thorough understanding of the international game at junior and / or senior level
- A goal keeping specific qualification or workshop (e.g. EH Bronze Award or GB Coaching Club Integrating Goal Keepers)
- A good understanding and ability to apply the demands of international hockey within a talent development environment
- Demonstrate experience of working with young goal keepers for talent development
- A track record of effective talent identification and selection that has supported effective player development

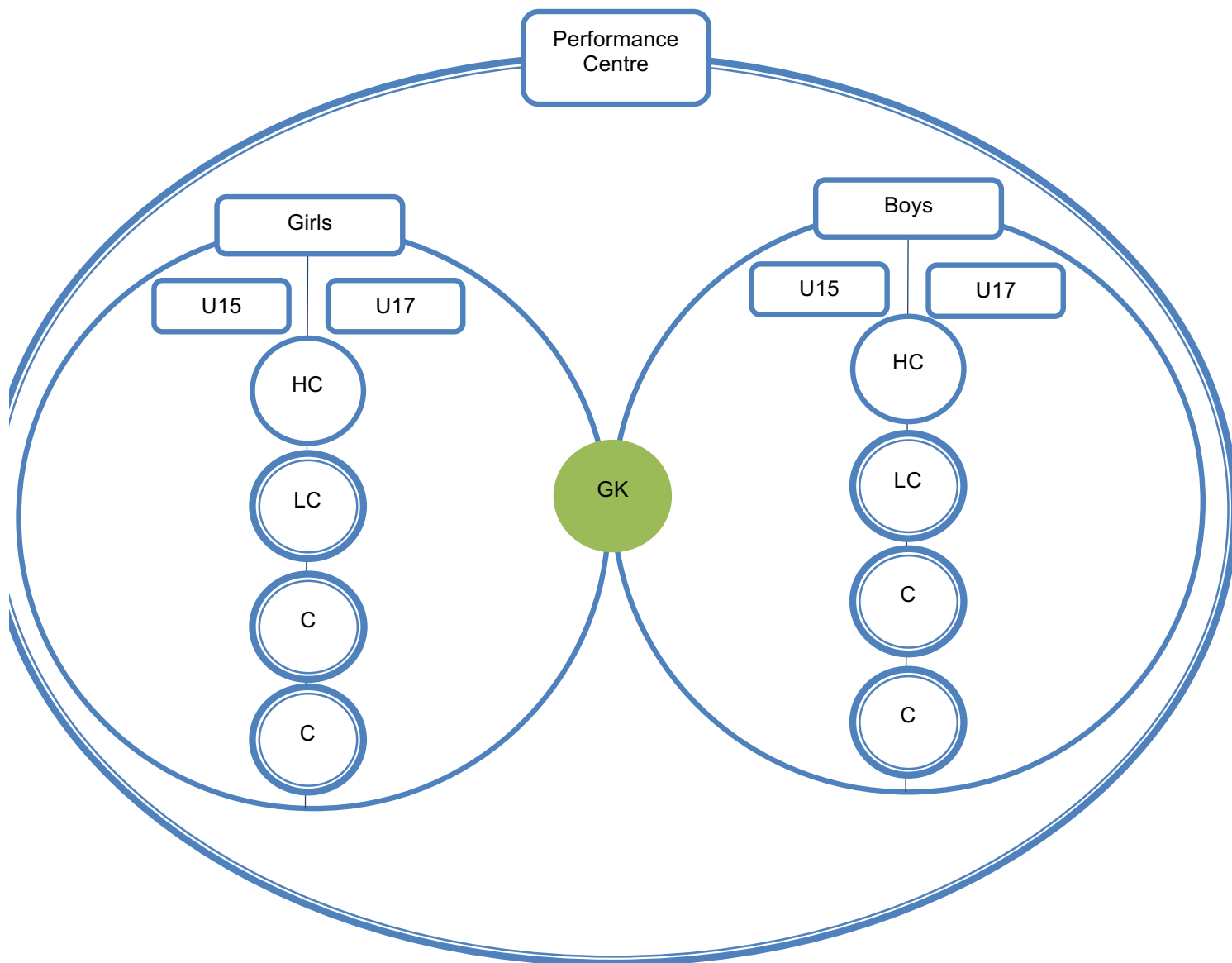
